PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

The conflict over the proper size and scope of civil government has raged for over 6,000 years. In fact, this conflict has existed for as long as there has been civil government. This battle is recorded in many pieces of ancient literature. Most interesting, however, is that this conflict is a recurring theme in the Hebrew Scriptures and the Christian Bible. The accounts of Babel, Naboth, Samuel, and Saul are but a few examples of this battle over the size, scope, and function of civil government.

In this battle, there are thousands of well-funded organizations that exist to promote big or bigger government. These groups persuade and lobby for the expansion of the state. In contrast, a smaller, but valiant group of less well-funded organizations exist to make the opposite argument—the case for limited government.

IPS is counted among that small number of organizations who are advocating for smaller government. But IPS is very different from these other "free market" groups. I think it is important to explain why IPS is so unique:

1. IPS Is Largely Alone In The Effort To Define "Proper"

We ask the question: "What is the proper role of government?" Call us idealists if you wish, but how can you effectively strive for change without an ideal—a goal to strive toward. We believe that it is not enough to advocate for smaller government. We must first define the proper roles of government. Then, and only then, can we effectively shrink government to its right size.

Much of our current political and social debate is characterized by a conflict between big government advocates and small government advocates—a debate of relativism versus relativism. This is a debate in which neither side attempts to define the proper role of civil government. One side always presses for more and the other advocates for less. But how much more? How much less? Who can answer that question? In my opinion, no one does this better than IPS.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE cont'd

2. IPS Is Principle-Based

We advocate principle-based thinking instead of practicality-based thinking. While practical considerations can be useful, it is principle-based thinking that is lacking in our world today. We believe that defining a "proper role of government" is difficult, if not impossible, from a practical or utilitarian perspective. But when sound principles are established (principles found in the pages of Scripture), it is much easier to define the proper role of the civil state.

3. IPS Is Reaching Audiences That Would Not Otherwise Be Reached

Although IPS reaches a variety of constituencies, our primary audiences are Christian audiences. We have specific programs designed to reach churches, homeschool students and families, private high school students, and Christian adults.

In the world of organizations that advocate for limited government, there is no organization like IPS. This annual report highlights just a few of our efforts during the past year to clearly present the biblical case for the proper role of government. To all who contributed to our work, thank you! We hope you are encouraged by the fruit of our labor. We believe and expect that we are igniting the candles whose flames will, over the coming decades, enlighten the world.

THE CHALLENGE WE FACE

A Visual Depiction of America's Decline

Three government institutions have been established by God for the proper functioning of civil society: Family Government, Church Government, and Civil Government (or the State).

The first chart reflects the proper ordering of these spheres by responsibility and shows each sphere in proportion and relation to each other. The spheres are related, in that, when one sphere grows or shrinks, the other two spheres reciprocate the inverse effect.

Take note of the resulting shift over time.



THE IPS SOLUTION

Changing Hearts and Minds

To meet this challenge, IPS works to restore the God-ordained governments back to their proper roles through education and discipleship. The following diagram depicts how IPS works to alter government institutions.



WHY IT ALL MATTERS

Government and economic systems are really a choice between poverty or plenty and life or death.



The issues of original sin and human depravity are the true root causes of human suffering. But every era of time and every corner of the planet has been cursed by the problems of original sin and human depravity. Why, then, do some periods of time and some nations suffer so much more than others?

The answer to this mystery is found in one word: **government**. The well-being of every society in every era of time is a product of how well each of the God-ordained governments (family, church and state) is functioning in that time and place.

When these three God-ordained governments execute their proper duties and refrain from over-stepping their proper authority, society prospers. Conversely, when these government institutions act improperly, society crumbles.

Because civil government has the most far-reaching power and because it has the power of the sword, it has the greatest potential for good or for evil. Unfortunately, throughout most of history, civil government has clearly been the most significant purveyor of human suffering.

The third world is poorer than America not because of the people who live there, their resources, or their geography. They are poorer because their governments violate the citizens' rights to property, faith, and speech. These governments redistribute wealth and pervert justice. These oppressive governments do what God's law forbids and don't do what Scripture commands. Herein lies the essence of the problem, and sadly, America is following the same trajectory.

In order to truly reduce human suffering, citizens need to produce government institutions that do their proper jobs... no more, no less. This is the greatest way to minimize the evils of crime, injustice, sickness, and poverty.

Even a 1% improvement in government saves millions of people from unnecessary suffering over the ensuing decades and this is why the study of government, economics, and history is crucial to any attempt in alleviating human suffering.

CORE PROGRAMS

Though IPS conducts an assortment of educational activities, its major offerings can be summed up in the following categories:



ADULT & PARENT EDUCATION

Change doesn't begin in the White House, but in each individual's house. To meet that end, IPS implements a range of classes, conferences, and seminars that are designed for adults and homeschool families. These teaching formats and topics expose families to a view of civics, history, and economics that cannot be found in the classroom or the media.



STUDENT & TEACHER TRAINING

Besides small group discussions, IPS predominantly influences teachers and students through the academic and competitive activity of speech and debate.

Through debate, students gain an interest in government and public policy along with the invaluable skills of research, logic, and speaking. Additionally, within the activity, IPS organizes and hosts workshops for teachers to teach them principles of government and economics – reaching beyond the clubs and into the classroom.

IPS manages and runs its own private Christian school speech and debate league, the Logos Forensic Association (LFA), as well as operates within the Stoa USA Christian homeschool speech and debate league.



CHURCH & PASTORAL OUTREACH

Since many of the principles that IPS teaches originate in the Bible, IPS acts as a catalyst for both thought and research to assist churches and the broader Christian community in effectively teaching biblical principles of government and economics. By meeting with pastors, hosting classes and events, providing wisdom and insight, and recommending materials, IPS helps pastors and other Christian organizations understand the biblically limited role of government.



PUBLISHING & MULTIMEDIA

IPS expands beyond its direct teaching ministry by including high quality, professional audio, video, and printed resources that are used to educate and influence thousands of individuals and leaders across America and around the world.

Through journals, articles, newsletters, curriculum, and the internet, IPS develops deep, well-reasoned materials that last and resonate beyond the "sound-bite" era of our time.

FUN AND GAMES WITH THE IPS STAFF

In May of 2018, the IPS staff gathered at the Winther household for a night of SOCIALISM: The Game.

Diogenes Games has created <u>SOCIALISM</u>: The Game as an unofficial expansion to turn the original MONOPOLY board game on its head. The rules of the world-famous Parker Brothers/Hasbro favorite depict an inaccurate characterization of market capitalism, whereas <u>SOCIALISM</u>: The Game depicts, very closely, an accurate characterization of the socialist economic system.

Since IPS teaches many historical, economic, and biblical principles against socialism, this game was a must try... and it did not disappoint in bringing the flaws of socialism to life.

How the Game Works

(from the game's website)

<u>SOCIALISM:</u> The Game consists of an enlightened rule-book, a quick-reference card, 20 "Fat Chance" and 20 "Communism Chest" cards, and 4 new game tokens.

The object of <u>SOCIALISM</u>: The <u>Game</u> is not to "win," but instead, is to achieve total fairness and equality through the renting and selling of property under a modern, progressive, and populist public policy.

You don't have title cards, you are granted a public "concession" to manage a property. Bankers? Regulated out of existence and replaced by the Federal Directorate of Redistribution (abbreviated "FDR"). Taxes? Get ready to pay. A lot. And you're not going directly to jail, you're exiled to a political rehabilitation camp.

Rent controls, eminent domain, micro-aggressions, and even "glorious socialist revolutions" are all in play, but in the end, the FDR controls practically everything, and the players all just wait for their transfer payments.

"It's all about fairness," Diogenes Games CEO John Elliott explains. "We all achieve equality in dependence. A player wins a traditional Monopoly game by bankrupting everyone else. In SOCIALISM, there are no real winners or losers—the game's over when everyone has 300 bucks [or less, which happens fast]."



Elliot continues, "We discovered that our game was a fun way to hypothesize what might happen if trends in public policy, trends that have recently entered mainstream political debate, were extrapolated to their logical conclusions in the capitalistic world of Hasbro's real estate trading game Monopoly."

Elliott says the results "aren't pretty," but thinks that they just might change the way people think about campaigns, elections, and politics in general.

All Fun Aside


Although not an entirely accurate characterization of the socialist economic system, this game demonstrates that socialism reduces incentives to work, save, or invest. It produces apathy, lethargy...and poverty. This game produces poverty in an hour or two. Real socialism works more slowly, but the outcome is the same.

Economic systems have consequences. A society's choice of economic systems is really a choice between freedom and slavery, poverty and plenty, and life and death.

Every year tens of millions of people around the globe die as a direct result of socialism. Although these horrific outcomes are most prevalent in third world countries, the west is not immune to the negative effects of socialism. Even in America, our partial socialism is producing poverty and limiting access to health care, resulting in economic hardship, illness, and death.

The Institute for Principle Studies is working hard (and having some fun) in the effort to combat socialism and its demoralizing, destructive, and devastating effects.


